

Linda and Gordon Bonnyman Scholarships

Post Graduate Study in the U.S.A.



J. Gordon Bonnyman is a Former Pupil of Jordanhill School. He has an MA from the University of St. Andrews and an MBA from Columbia University. He was Chief Executive and Chairman of Charterhouse Capital Partners.

The Linda and Gordon Bonnyman Scholarships have been established to support former pupils of Jordanhill School who are seeking to undertake a programme of post-graduate study at one of the elite universities in the United States. From 2017 the scholarships have been awarded and managed by the Jordanhill School Educational Amenities Trust Fund.

Eligibility

- To be eligible you must have completed a minimum of **4 years of secondary education** at Jordanhill School including S5.
- The university you are applying to must be recognized by the Trustees as an elite institution. The institutions shown below are not exhaustive.
- Your intended course of study must be a full Masters or Doctorate programme. Summer schools, visiting scholarships or similar programmes will not be eligible.
- You are likely to have work and life experience which is then reflected in your intended course of study. The application process to the USA would normally preclude you from progressing directly from your first degree in the UK.

Scholarships do not fund the full costs of a course. Normally, a scholarship will fund 80% of eligible costs up to a maximum of £70,000 regardless of the duration of the programme.

- If you have not already submitted an application you **MUST** submit an initial expression of interest by **December** of the year prior to your intended start year. You can use the [online form](#) or send an e-mail.

Further Details

The process of application to the elite universities in the USA is extensive. For entry in the following September, the deadline is typically in December of the previous year. Applicants may also have to complete online tests or submit other evidence in advance of this.

Your application to the Trust should include a copy of your application to the university along with all references or evaluations submitted on your behalf, a copy of any Financial Statement required by the university and the outcomes of any tests or assessments undertaken. Please also submit a breakdown of costs. (See sample below.)

If a reference or evaluation is submitted in confidence, then you should ask the person completing it to send a copy to the Rector of Jordanhill School.

The Trust will not meet any of the costs of your application or associated tests.

Award of Scholarships

The scholarship fund is managed on the basis that there will be one scholarship per year. Scholarships are awarded solely at the discretion of the Trustees and are conditional upon you being offered a place at a suitable institution and thereafter on you continuing to meet the academic and other requirements of the institution.

A scholarship will normally pay for 80% of the total costs associated with the course up to a maximum of £70,000. The example below exemplifies the range of costs which will be considered. Tuition fees and other fixed fees levied by institutions will be paid directly to the institution by the Trust. Any remaining grant will be paid to the recipient.

Recipients shall provide such reports as required by the Trustees during or at the end of the period of the award.

Financial Statement

You will be required to submit a Financial Statement as part of your university application. It is acceptable to mention the Bonnyman Scholarship from the Educational Amenities Trust as a **potential** source of finance. Quote the Trust's Charity number SCO 05743.

You should not accept a place or make a binding commitment without a formal offer of funding from the Trust.

Scholarships are intended to pay for a proportion of tuition and other fixed fees levied by institutions along with pre-agreed, documented living costs (principally housing). Travel and other incidental expenses will not normally be met.

It is likely that you will have to find additional funding from other sources such as your own savings, internships, part-time work or other scholarships.
