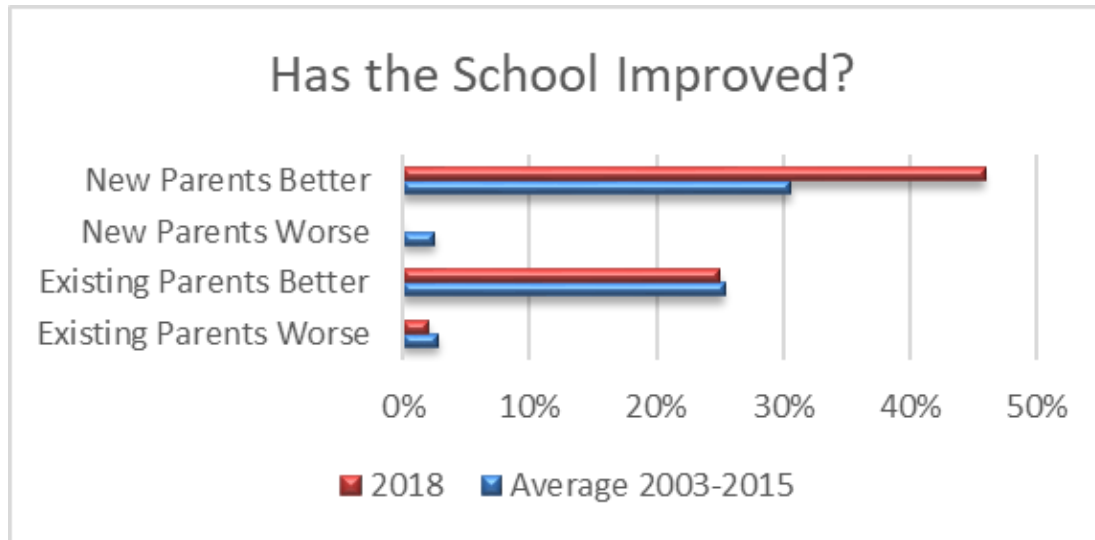


Primary Parents Survey 2018

- 178 completed questionnaires were returned representing a response rate of 38.5% (28.6% in 2015)
- The parents gave an excellent overall performance score **92.3%** (88.6% in 2015)
- Of the parents whose children were not in their first year at the school **25%** (32% 2015) said the school had improved over the last year and **2%** (2% 2015) thought that the school's performance was worse
- Of the parents of new pupils, **0%** (3% 2015) felt that the school had not lived up to their expectations and **46%** (40% 2015) said the school was better than they had expected it to be

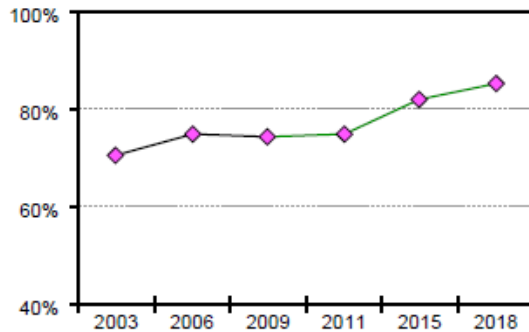

Compared to national norms parents rated us less well on only one criterion

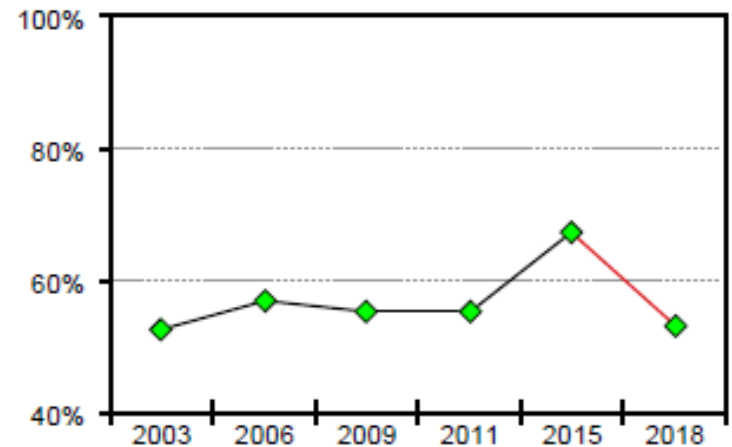
- Unexpected costs/expenses

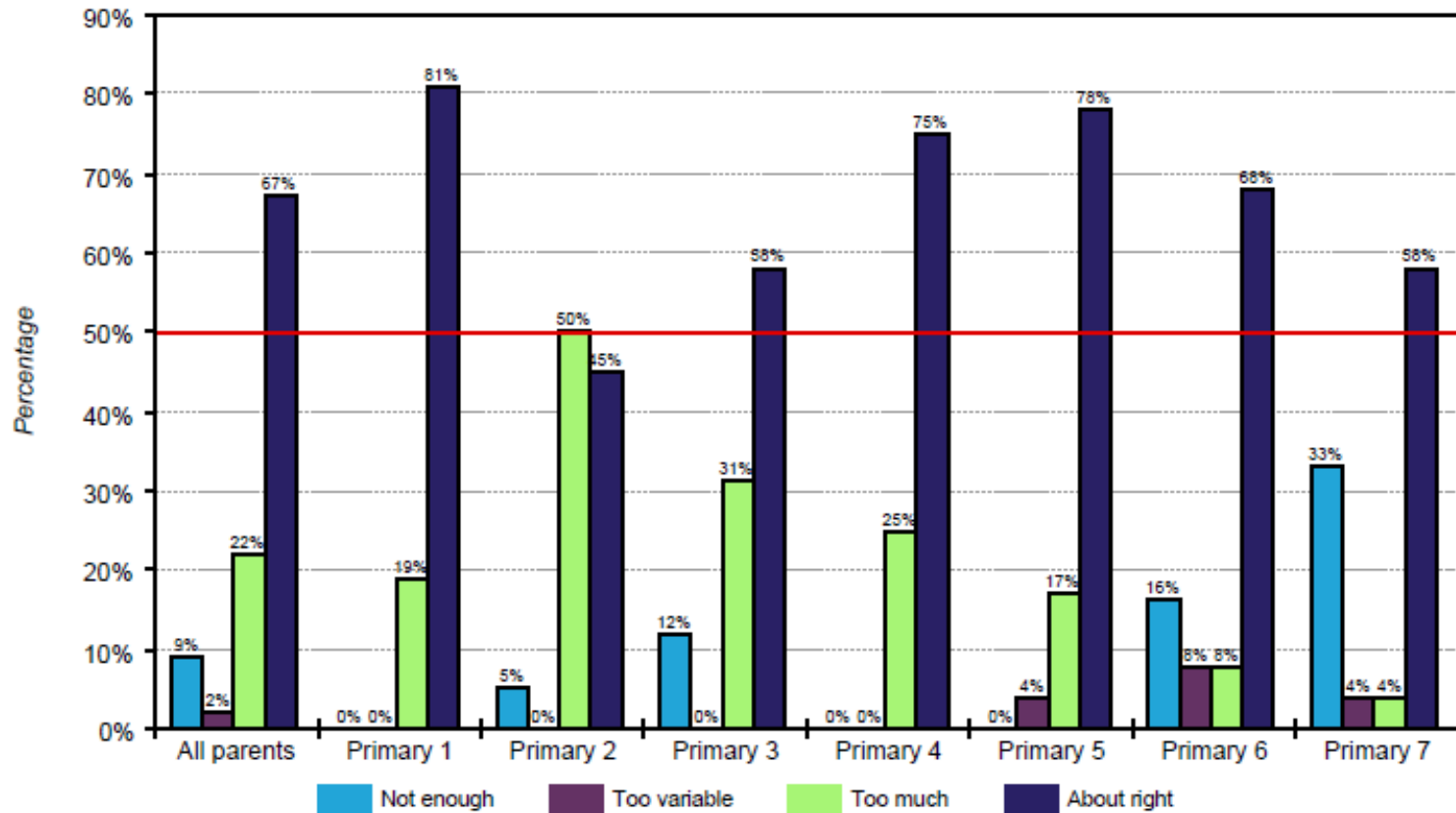

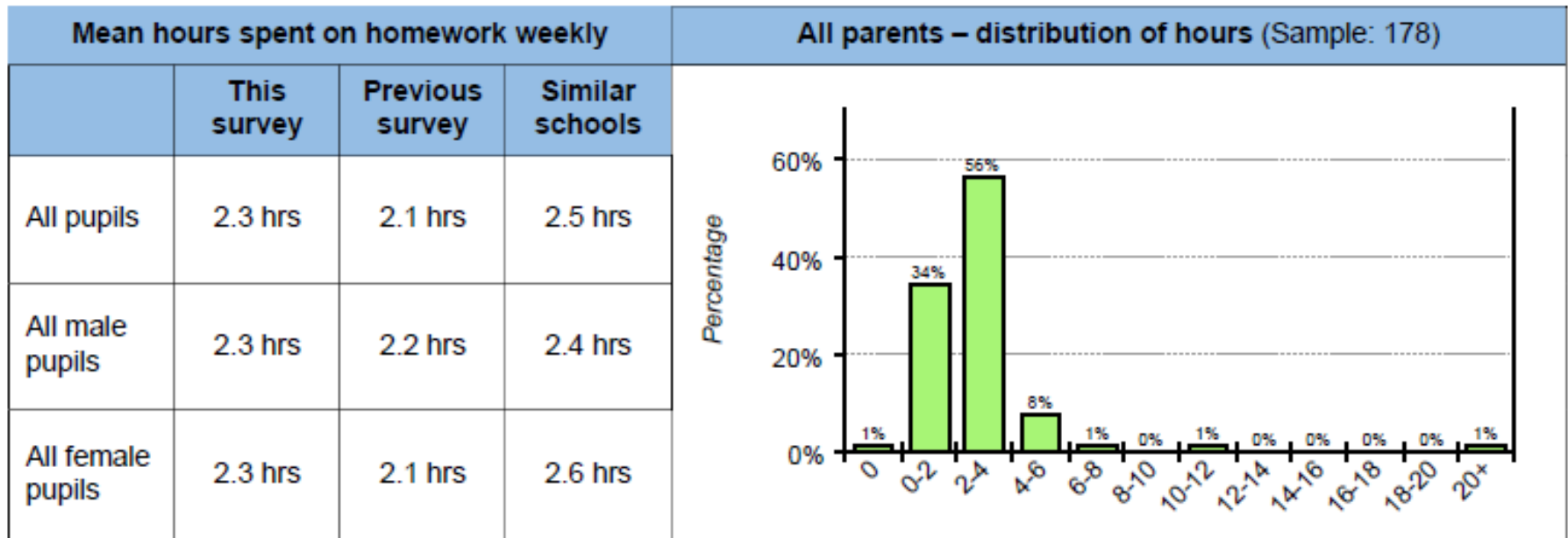
